- *This year is the 25th Anniversary of World Book Day.
- *The first World Book Day in the UK and Ireland took place on 23rd April 1997 to encourage young people to discover the pleasure of reading.
- *It is marked in over 100 countries around the globe still on 23rd April.
- *Every child in full-time education is given a £1 voucher to spend on books.
- *UK publishers produce a different selection of books each year that can be exchanged for the voucher.
